The International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) lists exposure to Carcinogenicity Data:

> chlorophenoxy herbicides as a class 2B carcinogen, the category for limited evidence for carcinogenicity in humans. However, more current 2,4-DB lifetime feeding studies in rats and mice did not show carcinogenic potential. Products similar to the hydrocarbon component are not considered to be mutagenic and are unlikely to cause tumors...

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Studies in laboratory animals with 2,4-DB have shown decreased litter sizes, decreased Teratogenicity Data:

fetal body weights and skeletal variations in the offspring at doses toxic to mother animals. These are considered to result from maternal toxicity. Products similar to the

hydrocarbon component are not considered to be developmental toxicants.

Reproductive Effects: No impairment of reproductive function attributable to 2,4-DB has been noted in

> laboratory animal studies. At doses toxic to parental animals, there were effects on the kidneys, adrenals and ovaries of offspring. At the highest dose, offspring mortalities and

growth reductions were observed during lactation.
