# 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

If in eyes, hold eyelids apart and flush continuously with running water. Continue flushing until Eye

# 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

# 11. TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

**Health Hazard** Summary

Asphyxiant gas. Symptoms of exposure are directly related to displacement of oxygen. As the amount of oxygen inhaled is reduced from 21-14% volume, the pulse rate may accelerate and the rate and volume of breathing may increase. The ability to maintain attention and think clearly is diminished, muscular co-ordination is somewhat disturbed. As oxygen decreases from 14-10% volume, judgement becomes faulty, severe injuries may result in no pain. Muscular effort may lead to rapid fatigue. Further reduction to 6% may result in nausea and vomiting. Ability to move may be lost. Permanent brain damage may result even after resuscitation from exposure to this low level of oxygen. Below 6% breathing is in gasps and convulsions may occur. Inhalation of a mixture containing no oxygen may result in unconsciousness from the first breath and death may follow in minutes. This product also contains small amounts of Hydrogen sulphide which may result in depression and damage to the central nervous system.

Hydrogen sulphide can cause inflammation and irritation at concentrations below 10 ppm. Eye Symptoms disappear when exposure ceases, but in severe cases damage may be permanent.

Persons with potential exposure should not wear contact lenses.

Irritant. When released into air the concentrations are diluted. Hydrogen sulphide has an unpleasant Inhalation odour above 0.12 ppm but odour is not an adequate warning due to paralysis of sense of smell. At

200 to 250 ppm, hydrogen sulphide causes severe irritation as well as symptoms such as headache, nausea, vomiting and dizziness. High level exposure may result in systemic poisoning, particularly on the nervous system. Unconsciousness may follow, and this is very rapid at concentrations above 1000 ppm. High level exposure may result in paralysis of the respiratory

centre.

Irritant. Contact may result in drying and defatting of the skin, rash and dermatitis. Skin
