2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

EFFECTS FROM ACUTE EXPOSURE:

INGESTION: Causes burns of the mouth, throat and stomach.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Store in a well ventilated area. Contents may develop pressure upon prolonged storage; loosen closure cautiously before opening. Mix only with water.
