4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects, Acute and Delayed

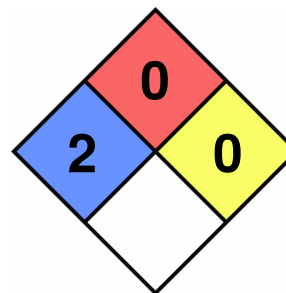
