Formaldehyde may cause mutations to non-reproductive (somatic) cells, based on animal data. Formaldehyde is classified as carcinogenic.

SECTION 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing media

Suitable extinguishing media

Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture / Conditions of flammability

Not considered flammable. However, may burn if exposed to extreme heat and flame. Toxic fumes, gases or vapors may evolve on burning. Closed containers may rupture if exposed to excess heat or flame due to a build-up of internal pressure.

Protective equipment for fire-fighters

Special fire-fighting procedures

SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

: Ventilate the area. Remove all sources of ignition. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. For spilled liquids: absorb spill with inert, non-combustible material such as sand, then place into suitable containers. Pick up and transfer to properly labeled containers.
