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4. FIRST AID MEASURES

5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

SMALL SPILLS

LARGE SPILLS

Sweep or vacuum up, but avoid generating dust. Collect and seal in properly labelled containers or drums for disposal. 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7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Handling: Avoid skin and eye contact and the inhalation of dust.

Storage: Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated place and out of direct sunlight. Store away from foodstuffs. Store away from incompatible materials described in Section 10. Store away from sources of heat or ignition. Keep containers closed when not in use - check regularly for spills.
